


























FBLA State President Candidate





FBLA Region II Vice President Candidate






TRUDY FRANK MANDAN HIGH SCHOOL





FBLA State Treasurer Candidate





MARLEE BOLL ST. MARY'S HS


FBLA State Social Media Coordinator Candidate
